Do You Qualify?

What's the **Procedure**?

Aid for Asset Students

To qualify for in-state tuition under the ASSET bill, students must:

- Have attended a public or private high school in Colorado for at least three years (6 academic terms).
- Graduate from a Colorado high school or receioved your GED on or aftter Septemeber 1, 2013 OR
 - If you graduated before Septemeber 1, 2013, you must show proof of 18 months continous presence in Colorado.
- Complete an affidavit with the College Opportunity Fund (COF) indicating that you have applied for legal presence or will apply as soon as you are eligible to do so.

If you did not attend a college immediately after high school, then you must:

- Have proof of acceptance to a Colorado college or university within 12 months of graduating from a Colorado high school or earning a GED in Colorado OR
 - If you did not get accepted to a Colorado college or university within 12 months, you must show proof of 18 months continous physical presence in Colorado

Complete the following steps to request ASSET in-state tuition:

1. ADMISSIONS APPLICATION

- Apply to UNC at **apply.unco.edu**
- Please leave the Social Security line blank even if you have DACA
- Under the "Citizenship" section, please select "Non-Resident/Non-Citizen"
- Please select "Yes" to the "ASSET Bill" question

2. UNC ASSET APPLICATION

This form needs to be filled out after your high school graduation or after you have received your GED. You will need to have your 10 digit SASID Colorado ID number on hand. You can get this number from your high school counselor. https://onbase.unco.edu/Registrars/ ASSETInStateTuition

3. COLLEGE OPPORTUNITY FUND (COF) APPLICATION

If you are ASSET eligible, the COF provides a tuition stipend of \$85 per credit hour. **cof.college-assist.org/Apply/GetPaperApp**

DREAMers are not eligible for federal aid, they may receive institutional aid based on their EFC (Estimated Family Contribution).



UNC APPLICATION FOR AID: Full-time students (taking 12+ credits) who are ASSET eligible can receive State aid including grants. Those who have work authorization or DACA may be eligible to receive work study.

MERIT SCHOLARSHIP: Merit Scholarships are awarded automatically after admittance into UNC based on academic performance in high school or at their previous institution. For more information visit **unco.edu/financial-aid/scholarships**

UNC SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION: This

application allows you to apply for multiple institutional scholarships. The application is available through URSA under the "Financial" tab. You must be admitted into UNC in order to apply, and submit the application by the March 1 deadline.

GREELEY/DISTRICT 6 STUDENTS: Students

graduating from a District 6 high school or Dayspring Academy in Greeley with at least a 2.5 GPA who are attending UNC immediately after graduation will be awarded \$2,000 per academic year. Contact your high school counselor for more information.

WELD COUNTY BRIGHT FUTURES

SCHOLARSHIP: Students who are residing in Weld County and graduate high school may be eligible for up to \$2,500 per academic year, as last money in. To apply contact your high school counselor or visit **co.weld.co.us**.

DREAMer SCHOLARSHIP: The DREAMer

Scholarship supports undocumented students in their pursuit of a college education, and helps remove the barrier around cost that so many of these students face.
