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Explanation of Enrollment Data

- 1. The Fall Census date is September 12, 2012. Data included in this report is information captured from the Banner Enterprise Data Warehouse (EDW).
- 2. Percent Change in this report is the measure of change from Fall Census 2011 to Fall Census 2012 as a percentage. Caution: When considering % change it is important to note that increases or decreases in categories with low numbers will result in a high percentage change.
- 3. Due to rounding, some graphs may not total 100%.
- 4. Urban Education students are included in Main Campus.
- 5. Colorado School of Public Health students are not included in this summary.
- 6. Funding Summary:
 - a. Headcount: Students counted in Extended Campus have <u>only</u> cash funded courses
 - b. Credit Hours: Main Campus and Extended Campus credit hours are determined by the accounting code assigned to the course.
- 7. Undergraduate definition of Part-Time and Full-Time students:
 - a. Part-Time: students enrolled for fewer than 12 credit hours
 - b. Full-Time: students enrolled for 12 or more credit hours
- 8. Graduate definition of Part-Time and Full-Time students:
 - a. Part-Time: students enrolled for fewer than 9 credit hours
 - b. Full-Time: students enrolled for 9 or more credit hours
- 9. Race/Ethnicity Categories adhere to the reporting standards as mandated by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB). <u>http://www.whitehouse.gov/omb/fedreg_notice_15</u>
- 10. Race/Ethnicity is self-reported by the student. Students may leave the question blank and cannot indicate "Do not wish to provide." Non US Citizens are students with a Visa.
- 11. First Generation is defined as a student who reported that neither parent/guardian graduated from a fouryear college.
- 12. Low Income is defined as a student who is Pell Grant eligible. Statistics in this report reflect those students who were offered a Pell Grant greater than zero.
- 13. The Graduate Unclassified classification is students who are attending but have not yet been accepted into a Master's or Doctorate program or non-degree seeking students.
- 14. Non-degree seeking graduate students are included in the Graduate School enrollment.
- 15. High School Undergraduates are enrolled students who are age 18 or younger and have not graduated high school or earned a GED.
- 16. New First-time students are not high school undergraduates nor are they Study Abroad, zero credit hour students. New First-Time students are defined as those students who are enrolled in fall and their first term was either the current fall term or the immediate prior term (summer).
- 17. New Transfer Students are undergraduate students who are enrolled in fall and their first term is either the current term (fall) or the immediate prior term (summer) at the undergraduate level and has earned college credit at another institution.
- 18. Freshmen classification are undergraduate students with 0-29 credits; Sophomore classification includes students with 30-59 credits; Juniors have 60-89 credits and Seniors have 90 or more credits until completion of a bachelor's degree.

Executive Summary

Headcount by Classification (Page 6)

- The total university Fall Census 2012 headcount of 12,497 is down by 102 students which is a -0.8% decrease from Fall Census 2011.
- Undergraduate headcount decreased 129 students (-1.3%) from Fall Census 2011 while graduate student headcount increased 27 students or 1.1%.
- Freshmen classification is 30.2% of the undergraduate population compared to 32.4% at Fall Census 2011.
- Graduate Doctoral headcount increased by 44 students (+8.4%).
- The number of graduate Masters students increased 16 or 1.1%. Masters students represent 60% of those at the graduate level.

Credit Hours by Classification (Page 7)

- The student credit hour grand total is 154,222 a -1.4% decrease from Fall Census 2011.
- The majority (86.3%) of the total student credit hours are resident (133,089); 88% of undergraduate credit hours are resident and 73% of graduate credit hours are resident.
- Undergraduate headcount (see Table Headcount by Classification) decreased -1.3% generating a reduction in credit hours (-1.6%).
- The graduate headcount increased (1.1%) yielding 5 fewer credit hours than Fall Census 2011 or a 0.0% change.

Funding Summary Headcount (Page 8)

- Main Campus headcount is 90% of the total.
- Undergraduate WUE headcount increased 28% or 113 students.
- Undergraduate headcount for students registering exclusively in extended campus courses declined by -1.8% (6) and Main campus headcount dipped -1.2% or 123 enrollees.
- Graduate Main Campus headcount increased 3% from Fall Census 2011.

Funding Summary Credit Hours (Page 9)

- Main Campus credit hours (144,413) are 93.6% of the total 154,222 the percentage is the same when compared to Fall Census 2011.
- The undergraduate main campus credit hours differ -1.7% from Fall Census 2011.
- Fall Census 2012 WUE credit hours are 5.2% of the total undergraduate credit hours.
- Graduate main campus hours increased 275 hours or 2.6% over Fall Census 2011.
- The total Extended campus credit hours declined by -303 credit hours, a -4.6% decrease over Fall Census 2011.

Course Load Summary (Page 10)

• The undergraduate part-time students increased 1 % over Fall Census 2011. The percentage of graduate students who are full-time remained the same as last Fall Census (42%).

Undergraduate Enrollment by Ethnicity (Page 13)

- Approximately 22.8% of the undergraduate population is minority this is an increase over Fall Census 2011 (21%).
- Within the minority category, the Hispanic classification is the largest and represents 14.5% of the entire undergraduate population. The Hispanic classification was 13.1% of the total undergraduate population at Fall Census 2011.

- Undergraduate Asian and Native American categories increased 5.1% (7 students) and 9.8% (4 students) respectively.
- African American undergraduate student increased slightly. (2 students)
- More students are reporting their ethnicity. The unknown classification as a percent of total declined 2.6% percentage points over Fall Census 2011.

Graduate Enrollment by Ethnicity (Page 14)

- The graduate minority population increased 1.6% going from 11.9% at Fall Census 2011 to 13.5% Fall Census 2012.
- Hispanic graduate students represent 7.2% of the total graduate population increasing from 5.7% at Fall Census 2011.

Undergraduate First Generation & Undergraduate Low Income (Page 15)

- Low income is defined as those students who are Pell Grant Eligible.
- Thirty-six percent (36%) of the undergraduates are first generation students which is a 2% increase over Fall 2011.
- Thirty-one percent (31%) of the undergraduate students are low income; this is a -0.8% decline when compared to 31.8% in Fall 2011.

Undergraduate First Generation and Low Income (Page 16)

- Approximately 41 % of all undergraduate students are non-first generation, non-low income students.
- There are fewer non-low income first generation students. 47% of the first generation students are low income compared to 48% in Fall 2011.

New Student Enrollment (Page 17)

- New first-time undergraduate degree seeking students decreased -3.3% or 76 students compared to Fall 2011.
- New undergraduate degree seeking transfer students decreased 65 or -7.0% students compared to Fall 2011.
- Undergraduate degree seeking continuing students increased 16 students or 0.2% compared to Fall 2011.
- New (degree seeking) first-time graduate students are down 80 students or -10.6% as compared to Fall 2011.
- Degree seeking continuing graduate headcount is up 122 students or 9.4%.

Students Enrolled in (at least one) Online Course (Page 18)

- The number of students enrolling in a least one on-line course increased over Fall 2011.
- The percentage of undergraduate students enrolling in (at least) one online course changed from 18% in Fall 2011 to 21%.
- The percentage of graduate students enrolling in (at least) online course changed from 39% of the graduate population to 40%.

Students enrolled by Gender (Page 19)

- The percentage of (undergraduate and graduate) females remained constant from Fall Census 2011 at 62% undergraduate and 74% graduate.
- •

College Headcount (Page 21)

- Generally, the distribution of enrollment among the colleges remains stable.
- The College of Natural & Health Sciences (NHS) undergraduate headcount is up 2.5% from Fall Census 2011 and represents 31% of the undergraduate total headcount of 10,102. NHS graduate headcount is up 8.8% or 47 students over Fall 2011.
- College of Education & Behavioral Sciences undergraduate headcount increased 14 students from Fall Census 2011. EBS graduate student headcount decreased 25 students or -1.9% from Fall Census 2011.
- The College of Performing & Visual Arts undergraduate and graduate student headcount increased 32 students (22 undergraduate students and 10 graduate students).
- The College of Humanities and Social Sciences (HSS) undergraduate headcount decreased 115 students (-5.5%).


College Credit Hours (Page 22)

- Undergraduate credit hours are up in the College of Performing & Visual Arts and the College of Natural & Health Sciences 3.4% and 2.4% respectively.
- The College of Humanities and Social Sciences undergraduate credit hours decreased -4.1%.
- Graduate credit hours are down -5.5% in the College of Education & Behavioral Sciences over Fall 2011.
- Graduate credit hours are up in Humanities and Social Sciences, Natural & Health Sciences and Performing and Visual Arts.
