Welcome to Campus Living

17 residence halls and 1 apartment complex to choose from.



Students who live on campus have a higher graduation rate and better academic performance than those who live off campus. Living on campus means you'll be integrated into the campus community and will be close to your classes and campus resources. Most first-year students are required to live in UNC housing through the completion of the academic year to ensure strong academic performance and success.

NAVIGATING THE HOUSING PROCESS

Use the application checklist below to help guide you through the campus housing process.*

□ EXPLORE YOUR HOUSING OPTIONS

Check out UNC's housing options and determine the best fit for you. Things to consider: housing style, community, area of campus, nearby amenities, etc. All rooms are furnished with twin beds^{**}, desks, chairs, window coverings and clothing storage. The cost of your room also covers internet, laundry and stays over breaks. Each residence hall requires card access for entry.

APPLY FOR HOUSING

To apply for on-campus housing, complete the contract starting in December at **unco.edu/housing** and submit your \$100 housing deposit.

(Fee postponement is available to those who qualify.)

REQUEST DISABILITY-RELATED ACCOMMODATIONS (AS NEEDED)

Reasonable housing accommodations are available and considered on a student-by-student basis dependent upon medical information provided and documentation of disability. The priority deadline for requests is June 1. Questions? Contact **drc@unco.edu**.

$\Box\,$ FIND YOUR OWN ROOM AND ROOMMATE

Once you've completed your housing contract, you will have access to find your room and roommates as early as March. You will be able to see where you have assigned yourself as well as who your roommates are as soon as you have selected a room. You'll also be provided with contact details so you can get in touch with your roommate via email or social media to get to know your roomie before you arrive.

□ CHOOSE A MEAL PLAN

UNC meal plans provide you with convenience and flexibility. Have a quick coffee, a snack between classes or a full meal. Meal plan options are available for all students to select starting in late July. For first-year students living on campus, meal plans are required. Learn more at **unco.edu/dining**.

ON-CAMPUS HOUSING REQUIREMENT

All first-year students who are under the age of 21 are required to live on-campus for one year. Students who meet the living in the local area requirements^{***} have the option of requesting to live at home with their legal guardian.

Find Your Community

A sense of community makes life easier while pursuing your studies.

To provide our Bears with the support they need to succeed, we've developed **three residential neighborhoods**, comprised of **17 unique halls**, houses and apartments on campus. Each neighborhood features the following services to help students along the way:

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT CENTER

This is a community engagement space to congregate with friends, explore campus resources, engage in skill development and participate in events and activities hosted by the community.

FRONT DESK OPERATIONS

Each community has a desk that is typically open seven days a week from 8 a.m. to 2 a.m. Staff at the desk are here to help with a variety of things, including:

- Help if you get locked out of your hall or room.
- Access to cleaning supplies, cooking items and even gaming equipment.
- Submitting work requests for room repairs or help tickets for concerns with internet or other technical matters.
- Connecting you with Residence Hall Staff.
- Help with room moves or other housing questions.

STUDENT STAFF

From your friendly Resident Assistant (RA) to the Desk Assistants and more, there are many student staff members here to build community and support you in your transition to UNC.

PROFESSIONAL STAFF

BASIN NEIGHBORHOOD

Situated closest to UNC's athletic facilities, the Outdoor Pursuits hub and the Campus Recreation Center, the Basin Neighborhood is great for students who want to be close to the action. Within walking distance, students can also find spots to study, dine or socialize, such as the César Chávez Cultural Center, Michener Library and Holmes Dining Hall.

HARRISON HALL — With five floors and 540+ students, Harrison Hall houses the majority of our first-year students. Home to a pet friendly community and near UNC's Outdoor Pursuits program, Harrison Hall is a very attractive option. **TURNER HALL** — The second tallest building in Greeley at 13 stories. Turner Hall is home to more than 300 Bears who enjoy single bedrooms with shared living room and bathroom spaces. Between classes, Bears can take in scenic views from any of the 13 TV lounges or play pool with friends in the game room.

RIDGE NEIGHBORHOOD

The Ridge Neighborhood is buzzing with spots for students to study, play disc golf, eat, socialize and relax on the many open green spaces. Located on West Campus, the Ridge Neighborhood is within walking distance of Holmes Dining Hall, the Turner Green outdoor space and University Center.

LAWRENSON HALL — A relaxed community of 430+ Bears, suite-style rooms make Lawrenson Hall a perfect option for international students and is home to a pet-friendly community. Many of these apartment-style rooms include a private kitchen.



NORTH HALL — With plenty of cozy nooks and social spaces, North Hall is home to about 370 Bears and offers endless opportunities to build lasting connections. North Hall is located across from Campus Commons and is only a short bike-ride or walk to many destinations on West Campus.

SOUTH HALL — Spacious suites with unique social spaces are the draw for the 340+ Bears living in South Hall. Located near the Butler Hancock Athletic Center and Gear Shop, South Hall offers students convenient access to dining options, classrooms and study spaces.

MESA NEIGHBORHOOD

The Mesa Neighborhood is a vibrant area located within walking distance of the newly renovated Tobey-Kendel Dining, the Student Health and Counseling Centers, Snyder Green and the University Center. The Mesa Neighborhood showcases some of UNC's stunning historic buildings updated with modern amenities and features various community areas where students can play, study, perform at the Garden Theatre or relax on Gunter Green.

BELFORD AND GORDON HALLS — These cozy residences offer students double or single rooms within a small living community. Each hall offers communal TV/study lounges and kitchen areas. Belford Hall is home to a pet-friendly community.

PERKS OF LIVING ON CAMPUS AMENITIES FOR DAYS

Living on campus includes access to perks and amenities you simply can't find elsewhere. Free Wi-Fi in every building, on-campus recreation center and equipment rentals, multiple dining halls, libraries and laundry facilities, just to name a few.

SABIN AND SNYDER HALLS — Close-knit communities with deluxe community-style rooms. Facilities include communal kitchens, lounges, TV rooms and study rooms. Floor plans for Sabin and Snyder on left page.

BOND, BROWN, DICKESON, HANSEN-WILLIS AND LUJÁN HALLS — These halls offer suite style rooms and two- to six-person suites with bathrooms, kitchens and lounges. UNC's "Presidents Row" buildings artfully blend historic English Tudor-style architecture with state-of-the art amenities.

WIEBKING AND WILSON HALLS — Double rooms in a large hall environment. Each hall offers easy access to the Asian Pacific American and Native American Student Services House, and the Marcus Garvey Cultural Center, with the César Chávez Cultural Center and Michener Library a few blocks away. Students share bathrooms, kitchens, lounges, game rooms, TV rooms and study rooms.

ARLINGTON PARK APARTMENTS

Arlington Park Apartments provide students with an apartment-style housing option just two blocks away from campus.

These two- and four-bedroom units are fully furnished with private bedrooms and a communal lounge space. All apartments include utilities (water, electric, internet, etc.), billed separately with a consistent and predictable semester charge.
