# Daniels Fund Scholarships a Big Help to CUE Students

The UNC Center for Urban Education thanks the <u>Daniels Fund</u> for awarding \$2,500 <u>Boundless Opportunity Scholarships</u> to 16 of our teacher candidates to help pay tuition fees for the fall semester. Scholarships were awarded to students from one or more non-traditional populations:

- Adults entering or returning to college;
- Active military members or veterans entering or returning to college;
- GED recipients;
- ROTC participants;
- Former foster care youth; and
- Former juvenile justice youth


