The University Honors Program fosters outstanding students by providing enriched course and research experiences, extra faculty attention, a community of intellectually engaged peers, and appropriate recognition for making the most of an undergraduate education. The program engages students in the life of the mind and encourages them to raise their expectations for themselves and their education. Honors students become intrinsically involved in their own learning experience, develop heightened critical awareness and independent thinking skills, and participate in research or creative works at the university and in the community.

Program Overview

The Honors Program offers several entry points for students with a desire to broaden or deepen their academic studies.

- 1. <u>First Year Honors Experience</u> (6 credits) Designed for both incoming students and continuing students who want an introduction to Honors education. The program curriculum is interdisciplinary and supports students to produce Honors quality scholarship. Students completing the Honors First Year Experience receive the designation "First Year Honors" on their UNC transcript.
- 2. <u>University Honors Program</u> (16 credits <u>inclusive</u> of First Year and Capstone Experiences) Designed for students who want to take full advantage of the intellectual breadth and depth of the Honors Program, providing access to upper-division electives and in-depth research experiences, culminating in the creation of a Senior Honors Capstone project. Students who completed First Year Honors simply continue their journey, but all UNC students -- including transfer students -- may apply for entry to the program as late as the end of their sophomore year. Students completing the University Honors Program receive recognition at commencement and official designation as "University Honors" on both their transcript and diploma.
- 3. Honors Capstone Experience Program (4 credits) Designed for juniors and seniors who discover Honors too late to take advantage of the full University Honors program or who want to explore their major discipline in-depth through the creation of an Honors Capstone project. This project may be in the form of a traditional research thesis, a creative work, or an applied project. Students completing the Honors Capstone-Only program receive an "Honors Capstone" designation on their transcript.

Advisor NOTE: The First Year Honors Experience and Honors Capstone Experience are the bookends on the University Honors Program. University Honors includes both sub-programs, plus a middle core of "Upper Division Honors" curriculum (additional 6 credits).

First Year Honors Experience Curriculum

The Honors First Year Experience offers incoming students the opportunity to experience Honors instruction as part of a learning cohort while practicing interdisciplinary analytical skills and building a foundation for academic success.

General Requirements

- Complete a total of 6 course credits in Honors introductory courses. Participate in at least one Honors Connect activity.
- Achieve a cumulative 3.00 UNC GPA.

University Honors Program Curriculum

The University Honors curriculum provides students the opportunity to engage in both broad interdisciplinary study and indepth exploration of a specific topic. It builds on the First Year Experience and culminates in an Honors Capstone project. University Honors students may complete their Capstone Project within or outside their chosen major.

General Requirements

- Complete a total of 12 credits of Honors coursework. At least 6 credits must be upper division. The Honors First Year Experience automatically satisfies 6 of these credits.
- Complete at least 4 credits of Honors Capstone requirements and culminating in an Honors Capstone project approved by the Honors Program and presented in a public forum.
- · Participate in at least six Honors Connect activities.
- Achieve and maintain a minimum cumulative 3.00 UNC GPA.

Lower Division Honors Courses: up to 6 credits

Note: students who complete the First Year Experience will have already fulfilled 6 credits of Lower Division Honors Coursework and should choose Upper Division Courses from the list below.

Honors Capstone — at least 4 credits

Complete the Honors Capstone Curriculum as described in the Honors-Capstone section. Students who complete the University Honors Program -- including a Capstone Project -- are recognized during commencement ceremonies and receive the designation "University Honors" on both their transcript and their diploma. Honors Capstone Experience

The Honors Capstone curriculum provides upper division students the opportunity to engage in in-depth study of a topic either within or outside of their major degree program and culminates in an Honors Capstone Project. Projects may include:

- a senior thesis based on research, experimentation, library or archival research;
- an applied project or civically-engaged business, non-profit, or curriculum design and delivery project;
- or a creative work in humanities or the arts.

All projects require a written component with critical, research-based, reflective analysis, and all students present their project in a public forum to educate others on their topic. Completed projects are bound and placed in the permanent collection of the James A. Michener Library, and Honors students also are encouraged to submit their final written project for inclusion in a scholarly journal, such as UNC's Undergraduate Research Journal. During their Honors Capstone experience, students work individually with a faculty mentor to strengthen their research, writing, creative, and presentation skills.

General Requirements

- Completion of Honors Capstone course requirements (4 credits).
- Completion of Honors Capstone project approved by the Honors Program and presented in a public forum.
- · Participation in at least two Honors Connect activities.
- Achieve and maintain a minimum cumulative 3.00 UNC GPA

Every final Honors Capstone project must be approved by the Honors Program and presented in a public forum to fulfill the capstone requirement. Students who choose a departmental capstone course should consult regularly with the Honors program to ensure they are on track to meet this requirement.

Students who complete the Honors Capstone Project without participating in the full University Honors experience will receive an "Honors Capstone" designation on their transcript.

The Honors Capstone is also embedded in the full University Honors program. Students who complete the full program earn recognition at commencement and a designation of "University Honors" on both their transcript and diploma. See the University Honors tab for details.

PLANS FOR FIRST TIME/FIRST YEAR STUDENTS ENTERING THROUGH FIRST YEAR HONORS EXPERIENCE

Fall semester start*

- For students with "First Year Experience," including those in exploring areas without a major who may not have the "First Year Experience" show up in Degree Works.
- All First Year Honors Experience students are automatically also enrolled in the full 4-year University Honors Program (which can be completed in as little as 2-3 years).
- * If first year/first time student enters UNC with Honors in Spring semester, they will ONLY
 be coded to University Honors Program, and not First Year Experience. They will follow the
 University Honors Program plan for transfer students and current UNC students beginning in
 University Honors.

Year 1 Fall Semester

COURSE UNIV101

- Students should, in most cases, enroll in the Honors designated sections. (You could add that as a note).
- Students who are also part of the CHE cohort are generally advised to enroll in the CHEcohort UNIV101 instead.
- Students in psychology are advised to enroll in an Honors cohort UNIV101.

Year 1 Spring Semester

After the First Year Experience student completes the above two courses in the first year with a 3.0 UNC GPA, the student will receive designation on their transcript and be recognized by the Honors Program for completing the <u>"Honors First Year Experience."</u>

Year 2 First Semester

- Honors Upper Division Electives include: HON 395 Special Topics, HON 492 Internship or Study Abroad, Any Departmental 492 internship course, any practicum, field experience, clinical or student teaching course, any study abroad/international student exchange, and many research based courses such as PSY201, SOC381, CHEM499, etc. (see list of courses in the catalog).
- The Upper Division Electives (6 credits total which can be one 6+ credit hour option, or multiple options that equal 6 credits, such as two 3 credit options) can be completed ANYTIME during the student's program and are not pre-requisites to begin the capstone.
- This Upper Division Elective may be done later in the student's plan if the major requires a full schedule of pre-requisites or other requirements, and the elective would fit better later in the student's plan. Some Honors students are fine to enroll in 18 credit hours, and that is a conversation that the advisor should have with each individual student. If a student has a strong GPA and feels comfortable with an 18-credit hour load, based on work load or other factors, then that option can be successful.

- The HON451 course is the Honors Capstone/Thesis course, and the student will be working mostly independently, similar to a Directed Studies course, on the project with regular meetings with their Capstone Advisor and the HON451 instructor.

- Advisors do NOT need to input both HON451 and a discipline-based capstone course in the Degree Planner if the student will be completing their capstone through the discipline. However, that decision may not be made until the junior year begins, and the student has had more time to determine what type of capstone they would like to complete.

- Students do NOT need to complete a capstone in their major discipline. (For example, we have had natural sciences students complete creative writing projects and humanities students complete applied leadership projects, and theater students complete psychology-based research projects.)
- Students may complete a 3rd credit hour of HON451, which is recommended if they have room in their program.

- Honors students entering Honors Program as transfer students or Current UNC students after their first semester must complete 12 credit hours of Honors Electives, which can be completed as:
 - 12 credits of all Upper Division or
 - UP to 6 credits of Lower Division Electives.
 - Some of the Lower Division Electives are approved as LAC courses.
 - A single 12 credit hour Upper Division Elective could be used to meet this requirement, such as a 12 credit hour student teaching course or internship.
 - However, in Honors we don't always recommend the MINIMUM path through a curriculum. Honors students should be encouraged to explore other Honors course options as well, as long as their program and financial situations allows.
- If the student would be better served with Honors coursework that can double count toward their major credit hours, use the Upper Division Elective options.

 Internship or Study Abroad, Any Departmental 492 internship course, any practicum, field

FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS and CURRENT UNC STUDENTS **BEGINNING IN McNAIR SCHOLARS** AT JUNIOR or SENIOR LEVEL

- The McNair Scholars Research Program is a federal TRIO program designed to provide undergraduate students with effective preparation for graduate-level study through research and scholarly activities, summer internships, seminars and workshops, mentoring, and assistance with graduate school admission processes.
- McNair Scholars must be either first-generation college students with financial need and/or members of a group traditionally underrepresented in graduate education and have an interest in pursuing post-baccalaureate degrees.
- The McNair Scholars Program is a pathway through the Honors Program.
- Students should apply to the McNair Scholars Program during the second semester of their sophomore year, and if accepted, will begin the program in the summer between the sophomore and junior years.
- Some highly qualified applicants may be accepted into a 'fast-track' of the McNair Scholars program to begin in the summer between the junior and senior years.
- The application process is highly competitive.
- Scholars receive stipends and scholarships to assist in supporting them while they complete the additional coursework required for the program.
- McNair Scholars have Degree Works sections for BOTH McNair Scholars specific coursework and for either the Honors Capstone Experience Program or the University Honors Program. The decision as to which Honors Program the McNair Scholar participates in is based on their unique circumstances. Most McNair Scholars will complete the Honors Capstone Experience.
- McNair Scholars complete research projects, and if their major includes a research-based senior capstone course, may combine their Honors capstone with their discipline-based capstone with approval from the Schulze Chair for Honors and Interdisciplinary Studies and the McNair Scholars Director.
- A research project outside of the student's major is sometimes approved if the student's Graduate School or Professional School path makes such a choice reasonable and is chosen in consultation with the Schulze Chair for Honors and Interdisciplinary Studies and the McNair Scholars Director.
