This four-year plan is a <u>recommended schedule</u> to complete your bachelor's degree in 4 years. Every UNC student must meet the following requirements in order to graduate with a bachelor's degree: earn a minimum of 120 semester credit hours; possess a minimum of a 2.00 cumulative grade point average; have at least 31 credit hours in courses designated as Liberal Arts Curriculum; meet all degree requirements in the student's major field of study. Each major and/or concentration may have additional requirements necessary for graduation. Students must consult with their major advisor to receive information on any additional graduation requirements.

Minor Required – Required. Minor will be waived in lieu of a double major.

Notes -

In addition to the required courses, each major will also take 24 additional hours of electives, 200 level or above.

- a. At least three credits must be taken in each of the three geographic areas (Europe, United States, Africa/ Asia/Latin America/World).
- b. Of the remaining 15 hours, no more than 9 can be taken in any one of the three geographic areas
- c. At least 18 of the 24 hours must be taken from courses numbered 300 or 400.

History majors must obtain a grade of "C-" or better in all history courses taken at UNC. Majors receiving a grade of "D+" or lower in a history course must retake the course—or an equivalent approved by the academic advisor—and receive a grade of "C" or better to receive major credit

- 1. All history courses numbered 300 or higher include a research and writing component.
- 2. Only 6 hours of HIST prefixes may be counted toward the LAC.
- 3. History majors must complete a minor of at least 18 semester hours, or a second major, preferably within the College of Humanities and Social Sciences.
- 4. The study of foreign language is recommended for those majors who plan to pursue graduate study in history.
