University Libraries Updates

Interim Dean Jayne Blodgett

UNC hired new Dean of University Libraries, Dr. Sheila Yeh, who starts at UNC on Monday. The Libraries completed its strategic plan and achieved the majority of goals. Primary accomplishments this year included the following:

- developing strategic recruitment goals
- 2 successful gallery shows
- planning for 2 traveling shows for the new year, focusing on medicine and student interests.
- coordinating study groups for students in January and April.
- Coordinating work with Facilities—new chiller installed; planning for next year's compact shelving.
- Managing budget restrictions, including travel restrictions.
- New position in teaching and learning; some positions on hold for coming year.
- New student orientations in library; resource fair in front of library.

Jayne Blodgett is returning to faculty position.

Jen Mayer will remain in her position as Interim Assistant Dean of Libraries.

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Programs and Activities in 2023-24

In fall 2023 the Friends of the UNC Libraries co-sponsored a well-attended tea which featured a historical reenactment by Susan Malmstedt as Frances Wisebart Jacobs. The event had been proposed for co-sponsorship at the Friend's 2023 Annual Meeting by members of the Mari Michener Gallery Committee to promote community awareness and interest in the fall semester exhibit *From Haven to Home: 350 Years of Jewish Life in America*.

While the Gallery Committee took responsibility for communicating in a variety of ways with the UNC campus community and known supporters of the libraries, the Friends' Board of Advisors focused on making contacts with and through the High Plains Chautauqua, United Way of Weld County, High Plains Library District, Beth Israel Synagogue, the Greeley Tribune's A&E supplement, and Greeley Creative District's weekly release of "What's Happening" calendar links. The tea took place on Sunday, October 29, in the Chin Multipurpose Room and entertained over 40 guests. Because we have email addresses for most of them, they will continue to be invited to Friendssponsored events and encouraged to join our organization.

Our focus during the winter months, largely with Teresa's leadership, focused on updating and adapting the content of our membership brochure and the Friends' website in preparation for a renewed membership effort in the spring. We are still learning how the online dues payment and renewals system works and how best to coordinate the Friends' communication needs with University Advancement's operations protocols. Teresa will tell you more about these efforts.

As for program plans for the rest of 2024, you may recall that UNC Libraries' Archives and Special Collections Department holds local author Connie Willis's papers, and we have recently heard from Connie that she is amenable to scheduling an author event for this coming fall. If you haven't already met Connie or experienced her creativity firsthand, I can recommend you read some of her thoughtful, well crafted works of science fiction and fantasy.

And here's something to interest fans of James A. Michener: Helen Reed, our Dean Emerita of the UNC Libraries, brought information to share about the upcoming annual meeting of the James A, Michener Society, to which many of the Friends belong. Their meeting will be held in Greeley this September, and it's not too early to register! Thank you, Helen. Is there anything you'd like to add? All this support provided to us during period of significantly decreased staffing for Libraries.

Communication and Outreach

Friends Board and Library Leaders in March 2023 sent updates of Friends activities and initiatives to supporters of the Friends, tailoring the communications according to affiliation: to Members, encouraging membership renewal; to Donors of Friends or Libraries, encouraging membership; to Lifetime members, encouraging donations; to student employees, encouraging membership; also periodic email announcements related to events and resources related to Friends and Library events

Membership Lists

Our colleagues in University Advancement and the Dean's Office in the Libraries have supported our efforts to update lists of our members. Mary, Jim, and I reviewed the lists and exchanged updates we had with Clare Buttry.

We have:

- 16 active annual members
- 22 inactive annual members
- 33 lifetime members
- 3 withdrawn members, who do not wish to receive correspondence from the Friends

We are reasonably certain that our membership lists are accurate and up-to-date. We will work with Clare on additions and changes as we learn of them.

Possible Timeframes for Membership Renewal and Review

We need to develop a workable schedule for recording and monitoring memberships since membership is renewable each year (July 1-June 30), whereas donations are accepted at any time.

Community Engagement and Staff Appreciation in 2023-24

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Agenda item: Dearfield Collection/Historic Preservation

Jay Trask, Head of UNC's Archives and Special Collections Introduced by Mary Adams, Chair

Presentation - Let's give our attention now to Jay Trask, Head of UNC's Archives and Special Collections, who has prepared a presentation on a subject of national interest. Dearfield, the site of a once-thriving Black homesteading settlement in northeastern Colorado, has long been a focus of research by UNC faculty members George Junne and Robert Brunswig, as well as Denver's Black American West Museum, former Weld County Commissioner Bill Garcia, multiple historic preservation scholars and enthusiasts, and now at last the National Park Service. The tenth Dearfield Conference, co-sponsored by UNC and the Dearfield Preservation Committee met in this very room on May 18 of this year. Some of you may have participated. Jay, we are ready to be further informed and enlightened!

Jay Trask provided a fascinating presentation on the Dearfield settlement, focusing on its history, accomplishments, research and initiatives related to Dearfield work and preservation.

Appendix A

Friends of UNC Libraries Annual Meeting Minutes June 22, 2023

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 12:31 PM. Attending Friends included Mary Adams, Jim Riesberg, Richard Dietz, Bryan Cooke, Carolyn Cooke, Eugene Sheehan, Teresa McDevitt, and Helen Reed. Attending Library Faculty and Staff included Jayne Blodgett, Rachel Borum, Jay Trask, Natasha Floersch, Kate Johnson, Jenn Beck, Rachel Dineen, and Jen Mayer. Guests included Sharron Riesberg. Meeting took place in Michener Multipurpose Room, lower level.
- 2. Mary Adams welcomed the group and summarized changes to the Organization and Governance Guidelines of the Friends of UNC Libraries, which were approved at last year's meeting. With the endorsement of the Friends in that meeting, and with subsequent guidance from the UNC Foundation, Mary, Teresa, Jayne, and Rachel prepared the requested clarifications, and the new Guidelines are noted as revised in May, 2023. Changes focused on administrative support with financial services for Friends funds, including Endowment funds; levels of Friends membership; secretary-treasurer position revised to become secretary responsibility (and membership fees now automated online on UNC Foundation platform).
- 3. Nominations were taken for positions on the Board.

Duties for the board of advisors are described in the Friends of the UNC Libraries Organization and Governance Guidelines.

Mary Adams continues to serve as Chair of Friends of UNC Libraries Board of Advisors.

Two (2) ex-officio representatives include the Dean of UNC Libraries or designee and a UNC Libraries Administrative Professional appointed by the Dean. These roles are fulfilled by Interim Dean Jayne Blodgett and Business Operations Manager Rachel Borum.

These additional positions are vacant:

- Vice-Chair
- Secretary
- Four (4) At-Large Friends

Teresa McDevitt was nominated as Secretary by Jim Riesberg; seconded by Helen

Reed. Approved by acclamation.

Jim Riesberg self-nominated as Vice-Chair; seconded by Teresa McDevitt. Approved by acclamation.

4. Updates from University Libraries (Jayne Blodgett)

Interim Dean Jayne Blodgett reviewed the significant progress of the Libraries in achieving objectives in the Library Strategic Plan. Examples include facilities improvements, new carpet in Skinner Music Library, and new adjustable height desks for all employees. Estimates are being sought for furniture replacement in conjunction with upcoming capital campaign.

Friends Endowment reached the \$25,000 goal.

Michener multi-purpose room is being named in honor of the parents of a generous alumnus and donor, Dr. Robert Chin.

The recent search did not culminate in the hiring of new Dean. Jayne Blodgett will continue to serve as Interim Dean.

5. Financial Updates (Rachel Borum)

\$4799 available in Foundation and Agency accounts

\$27,392 in Endowment

First distribution from Endowment will be in FY25, and distribution is based on a rolling 3-year plan, e.g.: \$350 (FY25), \$675 (FY26), \$1000 (FY27)

6. Opportunities for the Friends

Presentation by Kate Johnson and Rachel Dineen for Friends to co-sponsor Fall Tea with Frances Wisebart Jacobs (founder of United Way; advocate for recognition of American Jewish culture and philanthropy; event will include historical re-enactment); proposal developed by Mari Michener Gallery Committee; proposed date is for October, 2023. Teresa McDevitt moved that Friends support the Tea at requested level (\$349). Carolyn Cooke seconded. Friends approved the proposal. Ideas were offered about encouraging membership with the event. Jim Riesberg recommended remembering the late Robert and Monica Kahn at the event.

Presentation by Jayne Blodgett about Colorado Humanities/Center for the Book Speaker series. Jayne will share list with Mary Adams for possible speakers for Friends to sponsor.

Help with recruitment for new Friends of the UNC Libraries. Discussion took place regarding outreach to alumni and others. Advancement and Marketing can be of assistance in promotion efforts.

Jim Riesberg volunteered to serve on community engagement committee.

Teresa McDevitt will contact Jean Morrell and ask if Mary and she could attend an Emeritus Faculty luncheon and invite emeritus faculty to participate in the events and operations of Friends of UNC Libraries.

7. Presentation from Jay Trask, Head of Archives and Special Collections
Archives is working on numerous projects, including specialized music recordings and oral histories.

Jay Trask presented on the commemoration of *Michener Library at 50*

Jay provided such provocative details from the history of the Libraries as its first presence in a 8 X 16 ft cloakroom on campus; a raging fire in the new library building; the naming of Michener Library with James Michener present for the dedication; to today's collections with 1.5 million eBooks (owned or subscribed to eBook titles) and many additional substantial collections, resources, and services.

The 50th anniversary event was well attended and multimedia in format.
