*Curriculum Map for students transitioning from Aims Community College to the University of Northern Colorado for the purpose of completing a bachelor's degree. An AA/AS degree from Aims will result in a waiver of UNC's Liberal Arts Curriculum (general education) and the transfer of at least 60 credits depending on course grades from Aims. Courses with grades below a C- will not transfer to UNC, which could result in a transfer of fewer than 60 credits. Sociology Electives and Concentrations at UNC

Aims students should select SOC electives according to their interest:

- Family: Take **SOC 205 – Sociology of Family Dynamics** (SOC 120) and **SOC 216 Sociology of Gender** (SOC 221)
- Deviance and Social Control: Take **SOC 231 – Sociology-Deviant Behavior** (SOC 247)
- Inequality and Institutions: Take **SOC 215 – Contemporary Social Problems** (SOC 170) and **SOC 218 – Sociology of Diversity** (SOC 237)

This four-year plan is a [recommended schedule](#) to complete your bachelor's degree in 4 years. Every UNC student must meet the following requirements in order to graduate with a bachelor's degree: earn a minimum of 120 semester credit hours; possess a minimum of a 2.00 cumulative grade point average; meet all degree requirements in the student's major field of study. Each major and/or concentration may have additional requirements necessary for graduation.
