UNC Liberal Arts Curriculum (LAC) is waived with completion of AA/AS degree (if an AA/AS degree is not completed, additional liberal arts courses may be required). This guide is based on UNC degree and Colorado general education requirements from the above catalog term.

- ** The International Affairs B.A. requires oral proficiency in a foreign language. This requirement can be fulfilled by:
 - 1. Three credits in a foreign language at the 300 level or above;
 - 2. Demonstrated proficiency at the intermediate/low level on the ACTFL/ETS Oral Proficiency Interview;
 - 3. Other evidence approved by the student's departmental advisor.

This guide assumes the student has no existing foreign language proficiency at the beginning of Year 1. If a student is able to fulfill this requirement in fewer courses than outlined in this guide, substitute additional University-wide elective credits.
