- Question 5:
 - o Agree to endorse CWG recommendations.
- Ouestion 6:
 - o Agree to endorse CWG recommendations.
- Question 7:
 - o Best to leave it up to program/department to decide.
 - PVA does not require a minor because of how intense the PVA program
 is
 - o Is there data on programs on which minors can be selected.
 - The English department would like to keep the minor.
 - There is a chance students will continue to register for lower-level courses until they reach 120 if they do not have a minor.
 - o Continue current practice.
- Ouestion 8:
 - o It may be an issue for PVA since students are required to have a concertation and will lower enrollment.
 - o It was suggested that in the English Department to keep the current requirements so students can have that flexibility.
 - Can this policy be revisited so that departments can determine whether they want to increase or not?

- o 6 credits would be more flexible in the case of prerequisites.
- UGC recommends continuing current practice as 6 credits of upper division is sufficient for a secondary specialization.

• Question 9:

- o Discussion about certificates:
 - Although certificates are not funded by financial aid, sufficient information can be provided for students transitioning to degree seeking.
 - Certificates are Increasingly attractive and there are employers that are willing to pay the tuition for a student's certification.
 - An option of creating an app for those that just want a certificate was suggested. However, there is no way to apply that to standalone certificates and coding will become complicated when differentiating between standalone or embedded certificates.
 - If certificates are helpful to students after graduating certificates should be offered liberally.
- o We should not only ALLOW double counting but encourage it.
- Endorse CWG recommendation. Note: it was emphasized by Admissions rep that we could and should do a better job marketing certificates that are not financial aid eligible to non-degree seeking students (we should not assume no one will complete them). NJM, OTR and Admissions will work on definitions and language.
- Question 10:
 - o There seems to be little harm in codifying a minimum of 9 credits.
 - Endorse CWG recommendations.
